

TURATI COLLECTION ARRIVES ON TIME.

Two years ago, **Sancal's** creative combo, **Esther** and **Elena Castaño-López** made a wrong turn on the metro when thundering through Milan Design Week's Fuorisalone. They were hit

by the atmosphere of Turati station and had an epiphany: this would provide the ideal backdrop for a new collection of products.

The firm's stand in the fair and other elements that surround

Turati Collection faithfully recreate some passages and invent others, always with the M3 line as a reference and colour palette restricted to grey, yellow and red tones.

This collection is also a tribute to the modernity of Milan and its conservatism, as the city creates contemporary classics.

LUCA NICHETTO DESIGNS A COMPLETE SET OF PRODUCTS FOR SANCAL.

A JOURNEY THROUGH TEXTURES, COLOURS AND GEOMETRIES.

To honour the contemporary classics, **Sancal** has turned to the acclaimed **Nichetto Studio**. From the first moment the designer loved the concept and offered to create a complete set of products. Four singular models, designed by the Venetian genius, inspired by the emblematic Milanese station, **Turati** on the M3 line. This provides

a common aesthetic that runs through the presentation of Sancal's diverse collection of new products. Just like people on a station, each of our pieces has its own personality and job to do. Take your seat on a **Next Stop** sofa, an **Interchange** bench, a **Meeting Point** pouf or carefully step onto a **Mind the Gap** rug.



GOOD THINGS COME TO THOSE WHO WAIT.


Nichetto took the symmetry of train seats and the M3's lighting as inspiration for the seat and back cushions. The result is an endless modular seating programme.



CROSSROADS.

The bench base is inspired by the architectural forms of Turati station's lattice ceiling. A highly adaptable solution, it combines geometry, materials and functions. **Interchange**'s versatility means that it is ideal for both domestic spaces or contract projects.





GOOD WAY TO START.


Made of 100% pure virgin wool by the expert hands of a select team of artisans, **Mind the Gap** rugs are inspired by the geometry and colours of Turati's platform. The manufacturing process can create very precise designs and generate different heights, adding an extra dimension. Circles and lines intertwine to create a hypnotic pattern.



STRANGERS ON A TRAIN.


Meeting Point is a pouf system which also integrates tables. The circle is the dominant shape, representing the station's hole-like windows that open onto galleries and platforms. The thin steel legs, coated in textured black epoxy, create an illusion of levitation.














ZERO IS NOT A JERSEY.

KNITTING STORIES CREATES TIES.


As part of the Turati Collection, Sancal presents Zero, an innovative knitted fabric, developed in collaboration with the textile designer Marie-Luise Rosholm and the product designer **Luca Nichetto**. A revolutionary

concept born ten years ago from the meeting between both designers. They had taken up the idea together with Sancal to dress the **Next Stop** sofa's soft shapes.

Marie-Louise has developed a knitted textile as if it were a "fully-fashioned sweater" that comes from the loom in one piece with no seams, ready to insert the sofa's cushions.

There are five bi-colour options to choose from that remind us of a knitted jersey: Petrol, Yellow, Light Grey, Rust Red y Mauve.

The manufacturing process is similar to a tailored jersey. A cover with seamless pockets which are filled with foam pads. This innovative process presents **Zero** as sustainable solution; the new textile generates virtually zero waise.

Getting back to nature to recharge and relax is one of the most pleasurable ways to disconnect from everyday routine and stress. **Rafa García** is a keen mountain biker and found inspiration for his latest piece,

Alpino, when he was out and about. The designer has infused the modular sofa with the sense

of well-being that he experiences when outdoors, creating a cosy refuge at home.

Estante is as versatile and cheerful as Juan Ibáñez Lax, Estudio Sancal's designer and the author of this modular

piece of furniture with acoustic properties.

The furniture's highly configurable design transcends

its storage function as it can be used as sideboard, bookcase, television stand or a divider. Add wheels to create a trolley or invent your own use case! The **Estante** is so playful that the different elements can be reconfigured at will.

that join one of Sancal's most distinguished sagas. In this new piece, the chubby upholstered seat is held aloft by a metallic cage support. Wine barrels inspired the original design, the saves of which are represented by the base's vertical bars.

sanity-madness, obsessionindifference, tradition-modernity, craftsmanship-technology, development-sustainability ... The dancer Betty Rollo will bring visitors into the intervention, evoking contradictory emotions.
